
#### **Executive Director's Report for 2018**

Delegate Assembly & Business Meeting, February 26, 2019

#### Highlights of 2018, a busy year for the Texas Association of Appraisal Districts, include:

- » TAAD enjoyed the participation of **246** member appraisal districts.
- "TAAD's education program continued to develop and expand in 2018. We served 665 students in 30 state certification classes and six RPA Review classes in Austin. Although TDLR abolished "secondary sponsors" TAAD continues to assist its members in setting up education courses across the state to reach many more students, maintaining our commitment to help appraisal districts bring reasonably-priced education to their local area. The TAAD Education Committee planned 31 programs to reach all segments of the appraisal district population. Topics covered included Public Funds Investment Act training, ethics training, legislative updates, as well as numerous specialized appraisal seminars. TAAD offered online classes (new laws and rules, chief appraiser ethics and ethics) that reached 266. In addition, TAAD renewed a commitment to professional development of its members by assisting IAAO with their Instructor Relations Committee and by offering 18 courses and workshops. We continued to offer RPA review courses for registrants taking their licensing exams. For 2018, we served a total of 1,588 students through TAAD's education program.
- » We continued our **Chief Appraiser Institute**, designed to provide in-depth training to new and prospective chief appraisers. There were 32 individuals in the Class of 2018. We also conducted our second **Chief Appraiser**Refresher, a weeklong course for veteran chief appraisers and staff, that was attended by 18 CAs.
- » Approximately 677 individuals and more than 184 vendors attended TAAD's Thirty-seventh Annual Conference in Fort Worth last February. The Conference Committee continues to work on providing the best program, speakers and facilities possible for a reasonable price.
- » Preparing for the 2018 legislative session, TAAD's Legislative Committee worked to identify and pursue a list of legislative priorities, met with allied organizations to discuss possible mutual interests, and attended, as well as testified at, House and Senate committees.
- » TAAD's executive board has worked to meet its strategic plan, calling for developing and maintaining a sound education program for tax professionals; developing educational opportunities for member district support staff; evaluating and improving the program of the annual conference; increasing membership and member services, and working with legislators, related organizations and state leaders to maintain a legislative presence.

For 2019, the TAAD staff and I aim to do our best to continue to meet the needs of our membership. We will remember that each of you members, whether from a member district, or an associate, affiliate or retired member, are the most important reason for our being at TAAD. Please feel free to contact us at any time to share your concerns, questions and comments. At all times we will remember that TAAD exists to be of service to its members; please let us know how the staff and I can assist you and your appraisal district.

### **Attorney General Opinions/Requests For Opinions**

KP-0238 (February 22, 2019) RE: Application of Government Code section 573.062, the nepotism continuous-employment exception, to a tax assessor-collector's sister-in-law (RQ-0243-KP)

Summary: Section 573.041 of the Government Code prohibits a public official from employing a person who is related to the public official by the specified degree of consanguinity or affinity. Section 573.062 excepts persons employed in a position for a specified continuous period of time prior to a relative's election or appointment to public office.

To the extent the tax office employs the sister-inlaw in her current position for one year prior to the appointment of her relative as county tax assessorcollector, the sister-in-law's service satisfies the requirements under section 573.062 and her continued employment does not violate chapter 573 of the Government Code.

KP-0239 (February 22, 2019) RE: Authority of a county to refund penalties and interest paid by taxpayers in certain circumstances (RQ-0244-KP)
Summary: Subsections 33.01 l(a)(l), (a)(3), and (d)

of the Tax Code permit a taxing unit under some circumstances to waive penalties and interest charged on delinquent taxes based on an act or omission of the taxing unit, or a formerly-correct address for payment, if certain requirements are met and the taxing unit receives a timely submitted written request for the waiver.

To the extent Hood County failed to mail a tax bill despite the County's possession of the taxpayer's mailing address, a court could conclude that the taxes are not yet delinquent, in which case the statutory deadline in subsection 33.01 l(d) for submitting the waiver request has not passed. To the extent Hood County mailed the tax bills in question such that a waiver of penalties and interest under section 33.011 is foreclosed, article III, subsection 52(a) of the Texas Constitution likely precludes the County from reimbursing taxpayers from its general fund for the amount of the penalties and interest.

Request No. 0171-GA RE: Whether a home-rule municipality may call an election to authorize a tax freeze when no petition has been submitted.
